
NORTHERN ILLINOIS SYNOD ASSEMBLY

including Becca's Closet, Rockford Rescue Mission, Rockford Restore (Habitat partner) and some local nursing and dementia homes. One nursing home staff member told the story that last year he found a game show with DVD that is a favorite of the residents. When

he said that he would attend the sale this year; the residents told him to find another game—and he did!

Whether you donated a few items or several boxes; or worked a couple hours sorting or during the actual sale, or spent time digging plants for the ever popular plant tent, the suc-


may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us."
